Countdown to January 12, 2015...

On January 12, 2015 the new Rhode Island Child Care and Early Learning Facilities Fund will officially launch and be open for business! The RICCELFF builds on the momentum of LISC's existing Rhode Island Child Care Facilities Fund, which has been in operation since 2001. Our newly designed child care and early learning facilities website will be live on January 12, 2015. It can be accessed from the Rhode Island LISC site at www.rilisc.org or directly by visiting www.riccelff.org. The site will offer an extensive and searchable resource library, on-line applications for funding and technical assistance, and an interactive forum that will allow you to ask questions, share ideas and engage in discussions about best practice in child care and early learning facility design.

Beginning on January 12, 2015, qualified and eligible organizations will be able to apply for capital and planning grants on-line. A total of \$800,000 is currently available for facility grants. Organizations can apply for:

Planning grants in the range of \$5,000 - \$20,000. Planning grants can be used to pay professionals such as architects, engineers, landscape architects and playground professionals. These grants are intended to help organizations accomplish the following:

- Determine the costs of a proposed project
- Determine the feasibility of a proposed project
- Develop a plan to prioritize needed facility improvements
- Develop a plan to address health and safety issues indoors or on playgrounds

Capital grants in the range of \$10,000 - \$50,000. These grants can be used for actual construction/renovation work in qualified child care facilities. Priority uses for these funds include addressing licensing issues; major health and safety concerns; and barriers to moving up the quality ladder. Priority will be given to organizations serving high need children that can demonstrate an ability to complete the proposed project in a timely

manner; provide matching funding; and manage a construction project that includes Davis Bacon compliance.

Beginning on January 12, 2015 the RICCELFF will also be instituting an application process for technical assistance. RICCELFF staff and consultants cannot take the place of your real estate team, but can provide substantial support as you undertake facility projects. The following are examples of the types of technical assistance the RICCELFF can provide:

- Navigating the overall real estate development process
- Finding and contracting with your real estate development team
- Obtaining playground audits, prioritizing needs and implementing improvement plans
- Conducting facility assessments, prioritizing needs and implementing improvement plans
- Developing a fundraising/financing plan for your project
