

# Frequently Asked Questions on the Grant and Technical Assistance Process

Please be sure to visit our <u>online forum</u> for the most up-to-date questions and answers on the grant process, technical assistance and a variety of other facility-related topics. If you have questions please feel free to post them there! Here are answers to some common questions and some helpful tips:

- If you need to develop a plan for your space, for example you know that you need to re-do your playground but you need a comprehensive plan, cost estimates, etc., then you should apply for a <u>planning grant</u>. Our technical assistance will not result in full plan drawings such as those that can be secured with the resources available through planning grants. If you have additional questions or are unsure of which application to complete please contact us at <u>riccelff@lisc.org</u>.
- One center can submit multiple applications (for example you can apply for both a planning and a capital grant, or you can apply for technical assistance and a planning
